


<p><b>Personal and Social Development</b></p> <p>Talk to an adult about how to safe around water.</p>  <p>The rainbow fish gave his most prized possessions - his scales - away. What is your most prized possession? Draw a picture of it and say why it is special.</p>	<p><b>Communication and Language</b></p> <p>Tell the story of The rainbow fish to someone in your house. Why was he happy at the end of the story even though he no longer had his scales.</p> <p>The rainbow fish learnt to be a good friend. Talk to an adult about what makes a good friend.</p>	<p><b>Physical Development Aiming</b></p> <p><b>Bottle bowling</b> Gather together a range of plastic bottles. Place the bottles together - stand a short distance away. Roll a ball at the bottles and try to knock them all over.</p> <p><b>Target tubs</b> Find a range of boxes and containers. Put them on their sides so an object can be rolled into them. Make different sized paper balls. Stand a short distance away and try to roll the balls into them.</p> <p><b>Under the bridge</b> Ask an adult to make some bridges out of cardboard boxes. Roll balls underneath the bridges</p>	<p><b>Literacy - Reading</b> Our story this week is <b>The rainbow Fish</b> (search on YouTube Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister)</p>  <p>Look at some fact books about sea creatures. Talk about the difference between story books and fact books Talk about the contents page / fact books usually have photographs. Can you find out 3 things about a sea creature?</p> <p>Make a reading den outside using blankets and cushions</p> <p>Our <b>rhymes</b> this week are: 12345 once I caught a fish</p> <p>RWi Ditty 3 (See APP) Handwriting sheets</p>	<p><b>Literacy - Phonics</b> <b>General sound discrimination</b></p> <p>Listen to some music at home with your family. Can you all clap along with the beat?</p> <p>Sing Pat-a-cake pat-a-cake baker's man, Bake me a cake as fast as you can Clap your hands together to the beat</p> <p>Use your voice to make sounds like a ghost, a car, bubbles under water</p> <p>Talk about sounds you like and sounds you don'tlike and why. Draw a picture of sounds you like eg birds singing, the sea or a doorbell</p>
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## Literacy - writing

## Maths - Number

Make a collection of natural objects eg stones, sticks -use them to sort, count, match etc

### Sticks and stones activity(see sheet)

Can you help to make a person using sticks and stones?

• Can you count out two sticks to make the legs?

• How many sticks will you need to count out for the arms?

• Can you count out one large stone for the body?

• How many stones will you need to count out for the head?

## Maths- Shape, space measures

Set up a bucket outside and fill with water. Add some bottles, tubs and containers. Spend some time emptying and filling containers. If you fill one up does that amount of water fit into another? Which do you think holds the most water? How could you find out?

### 2d shapes

#### Making shapes (see sheet)

Make a collection of sticks and pebbles. Use the sticks or pebbles to make a shape. What shape did you make? Can you tell a grown-up about your shape? Then, try making another shape. Can you make a triangle, a square, a rectangle and a circle?

## Understanding of the world

Some creatures that live under the sea have fins to help them move around. Others have legs to move around with. Can you think of some creatures with fins / legs?



Have a look around your home and find 2 things that you think will float and 2 things which will sink. Ask an adult to help you test to see if you are right.



Have a look around your home. How many items of technology can you find? Talk to an adult about what they are used for

## Expressive Arts

Fill a shallow tray with water and add some washing up liquid. Cut the bottom off a plastic bottle and ensure it is not sharp. Cover with an old sock. Dip into the water and then blow through the top of the bottle. Can you make a bubble snake? How long can you make it?



Half fill 6 glasses with water and add red blue and yellow colouring so that you have 2 glasses of each colour. What new colours can you make?



Make a different rainbow animal using paint, junk modelling or play dough.
