It is hard to believe we are at the end of term. What a term it has been! For most of this term we returned to a more normal way of working. There have been two residential visits, school trips, visits from a police dog and the fire service to name a few. Year 3 have also completed their pedestrian training. I am so immensely proud of all of our children and their ongoing enthusiasm for learning. This was evident during a recent visit to school by Stockton's Head of Education where children discussed their learning and shared their acquired knowledge across the breadth of the curriculum. This term we have also been awarded The Primary Science Quality Mark for our science curriculum. This is a huge achievement considering the disruption to schools by the pandemic.



Covid 19

Our plans for Christmas this year have changed significantly due to Covid. The priority has been the health and well-being of children, families and staff and trying to avoid isolations over the Christmas period. We continue to have a robust

risk assessment and contingency outbreak plan in place should we have a rising number of cases. In line with the risk assessment should your child display symptoms in school however mild, we will ask you to collect them from school and arrange a PCR test. In line with guidance, where a family member has tested positive, children can still attend school unless they display symptoms, test positive on a PCR, or is a contact of someone who has the Omicron variant. We will follow all advice in relation to the Omicron variant.

Christmas in School

During this final week of term, we are focusing on Christmas activities for the children. The children have been enjoying crafts such as making a Christingle, having fun at parties and we have been able to stream the performance of Elf into school. Like you I can't wait to watch all of the children's performances on Seesaw at the end of the week. We have everything crossed that next year we can celebrate Christmas with you as a school family.

Attendance

Covid and seasonal illness has continued to affect attendance. Our current whole school attendance rate is 94.1%, whilst lower than we would normally expect, this is still higher than the current national figure.



The class with the highest attendance continues to be Miss Harrison's Year 6 class with an attendance of 95.7%, closely followed by Mr Lamb's Year 4 class with an attendance of 95.2%. Well done everyone.

In line with our Attendance Policy, leave of absence requests will only be authorised by the school in exceptional circumstances. The policy is available on the website. Where holidays have been rescheduled due to Covid, we will need to see the original booking documentation when considering the leave of absence request. All other requests will be categorised as unauthorised and subject to a fixed penalty notice referral in line with school policy.

Car Park

We are continuing to operate a drop zone each morning for children in KS2. This is to try and support the car parking situation on a morning by removing the need for some cars to park. This is a difficult situation to navigate as the car park is not a parental car park but designed to accommodate staff and visitors to the school. This term we have had two incidents where cars have been damaged and so I politely ask that if

you are coming into the car park that you take great care.
