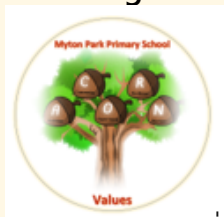
Staff have worked hard over the summer to prepare classrooms and lessons and we have embedded our ACORN values into everything we do.

Attendance for 2024-2025 was 95.8% which is higher than the national rate of 93.1% - thank you for your support.
